# AdministrativeFIX Blog Policy 

## About the Blog

The Administrative Conference of the United States (ACUS) is an independent federal agency charged with convening expert representatives from the public and private sectors to recommend improvements to administrative process and procedure.

AdministrativeFIX is the official blog of ACUS. Its goal is to foster a dialogue on issues related to administrative processes and procedures. The blog provides a space for those interested in ACUS and administrative procedure to learn more about the Agency and its initiatives.

## Authorship of Blog Posts

ACUS staff author and upload posts to AdministrativeFIX. The blog publishes posts from individuals other than ACUS staff only in the limited situations addressed below.

## Subject of Blog Posts

Blog posts address matters related to the mission, history, research, recommendations, and other ongoing and past initiatives of the Agency.

## Guest Posts

In limited situations, ACUS staff may invite a current or past ACUS consultant or committee chair to submit a guest post to AdministrativeFIX related to his or her work with ACUS.

Any current ACUS consultant or committee chair who believes it would be appropriate for AdministrativeFIX to publish a post related to an ongoing ACUS initiative should send a brief pitch by email to the Executive Director. The Executive Director will determine, in his or her discretion, whether the blog will publish the post. The Executive Director will also determine who will author the post-the consultant or committee chair who proposed it, ACUS staff, or another individual consistent with the Administrative FIX Blog Policy.

## Comments

ACUS does not at this time allow any individual to comment on AdministrativeFIX blog posts.
If a member of the ACUS Council or Assembly or an ACUS staff member identifies an error in a blog post, he or she may submit a proposed correction by email to the Director of Finance and Operations.
