I support the idea of a Small Claims Patent Court.

I believe the post-grant proceedings, as currently administered, have reduced the value and importance of patents. The reduction of value and importance of patents has hurt innovation.

I think, if properly administered and formatted in a bi-partisan way – see, e.g., the ITC, which remains the patent forum of choice for patentees - a Small Claims Patent Court can increase the value and importance of patents in the US. This will increase innovation.

We must proceed with caution, however, because we don't want a return to the NPEladen world of the late 1990's and 2000's which stifled many big US companies.

I wish the best to all in this endeavor which can re-ignite US innovation in a way that can benefit us all.


